By hearing the same language at home and at school, you send your child a message of what is important and that we are all on the same team—the team that wants to help your student succeed. Below is a summary of each of the habits:

- Habit 1: Be Proactive (I'm Responsible for Me)
- Habit 2: Begin With the End in Mind (Have a Plan)
- Habit 3: Put First Things First (Work First, Then Play)
- Habit 4: Think Win-Win (Everyone Can Win)
- Habit 5: Seek First to Understand, Then to Be Understood (Listen Before You Talk)
- Habit 6: Synergize (Together Is Better)
- Habit 7: Sharpen the Saw (Balance Feels Best)

In order to encourage the 7 Habits language at home, here are some questions you can ask your child:

- How were you proactive today?
- What is your end in mind with this project/work/task?
- How do you plan to put first things first in this situation?
- What would be a win-win for us?
- I want to hear what you think first and then I will share. How do you know when you are being listened to?
- How can we work together on this?
- How would you like to sharpen your saw today?

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

Hello King Center CS Families:

All King Center CS Students who do not have a King Center device already will receive a Lenovo 300e Chromebook to **keep at home** until June 21st, 2024. **We need the Device Form completed before we can hand out the device to your child.** The Chromebook devices at home will serve a few purposes in enriching the student education career.

•Homework and assignments can be done using the device •Individual quarantine - Immediately Asynchronous Learning (students accessing class materials, videos, and assignments at their own pace)

•King Center CS or your child classroom need to be quarantined - Immediate Remote Learning can Start.

How can I qualify?

You, or your child or dependent are enrolled in government programs like **Medicaid**, **SNAP**, **WIC**, or others, or, Based on your household income

What are the program benefits?

•Service discount up to \$30/month (internet from Spectrum, Verizon, T-Mobile, AT&T,)

•Service discount up to \$75/month on qualifying Tribal lands

•Device discount up to \$100 for a laptop, tablet, or desktop computer (with a co-payment of more than \$10 but less than \$50)

Parents / Guardians,

We are in the beginning of a season of several contagious illnesses (viral and bacterial).

The following guidelines are how we can maintain the goal of a safe and healthy environment for ALL students and staff.

•ALL CALLS/ REPORTS OF STUDENT ILLNESSES MUST GO TO THE SCHOOL NURSE FIRST/ AS SOON AS POSSIBLE !

•Most <u>CONTAGIOUS ILLNESSES / DISEASES</u> (for example--chicken pox, impetigo, pink eye, infectious skin diseases, respiratory airborne infectious illnesses, Covid, etc...),

•May require notification to others and have set guidelines by the state / local health authorities for return to school in order <u>to prevent a contagious outbreak.</u>

•The nurse will confirm the students return date and the necessary medical documentation that is needed to return and excuse the student's absence.

•Once confirmed information, the nurse will notify teachers/staff (that need to know), request educational supports for your student if needed.

•The nurse will amend the attendance to reflect the <u>documented medically necessary time</u> the student needs to be out of school.

•Make sure we have any new /emergency contact information (phone # 's, emails, and home addresses).

•Refer to other Health Office information and resources found in the KCCS website under "Health Office"

You can email or call the nurse with any questions regarding this. The Doctor's office may always fax any medical information.

(Only the doctor's office faxes will be accepted. Parent faxes or email of medical documentation is not acceptable, instead please provide the original copies)
